



What is the Steam Coast Trail

The Steam Coast Trail is an ongoing community project to build a breath-taking network of multi-use paths around West Somerset. It weaves walkers, cyclists, runners and wheelchairs through glorious coastline and countryside!

Where is it?

Phase One of the Steam Coast Trail was opened in December 2016. It runs 2 km from here at Dunster Beach (just past the Kiosk), almost all the way to Blue Anchor. Please note that to reach Blue Anchor, at the end of our path, 700 metres of shingle beach must be crossed, so it's not advisable for those with limited mobility and bikes must be pushed.

Phase Two of the Steam Coast Trail opened in October 2018 and runs 1.1km from Old Cleeve (Dragon's Cross) to Washford (Cobbler's Steps).



This means that you can use the Steam Coast Trail to reach other nearby villages by bike or on foot during your stay - why not head to Blue Anchor then take a stroll on the beach? Or for more of a day out, carry on up to Dragon's Cross for the brilliant Phase Two path to reach Washford. From here you could visit Torre Cider Farm or enjoy a drink in the beautiful riverside beer garden at the White Horse. You could walk down the Old Mineral Line which takes you to Watchet or catch a steam Train from Washford Station to carry on your West Somerset adventure!
